THE EDUCATION REVOLUTION

LOGLINE:

Signifying the assembly-line education model in America no longer works and needs to change, The Education Revolution documentary follows the stories of four high school students who chose to leave their traditional high school to pursue a public education option in a district focused on student passion, purpose, and vision.

SHORT SYNOPSIS:

The Education Revolution follows four high school students as they make the difficult decision to step away from the traditional school system to attend one of the largest career technical education districts in Ohio. Over the course of the 2019-2020 school year, amid the COVID-19 pandemic, this documentary tells the story of how an education steeped in personalized learning, unique initiatives, and innovative opportunities can transform lives and become a replicable model across the nation, ending outdated, one-size-fits-all education.







FULL SYNOPSIS:

More than 50 million public education students in America attend a standard pre-kindergarten through grade-twelve school system. This antiquated, one-size fits-all model of education assumes that all students of the same age should learn the same information, at the same pace, in the same way, and be able to identically prove their learning through standardized tests that then determine their ability to move to the next stage in their education. However, for more than a million students who drop out each year in America, this system doesn't work. These students are not finding their passion, they are not finding their purpose, and the death of the American public education system is at stake.

In *The Education Revolution*, watch as four high school students share their journey at a different kind of public high school, a career tech school that selects students based on their grit and tenacity versus grades or attendance. A school that models equity, access, inclusion and diversity and reveres students having a voice and a choice in their education.

Established in 1975 and located in Butler County, Ohio, Butler Tech is not only the setting of this documentary, but the catalyst for change. With a graduation rate of more than 99%, Butler Tech is disrupting the assembly-line model of the public education system.

Anjel, Noah, Gabe and Ainsley, *The Education Revolution's* featured students, came to Butler Tech looking for something different. They chose to leave the school systems they had always known to pursue a passion through their chosen career pathway. Once immersed in a culture that encourages failing forward – a belief that risk-taking leads to greater growth, watch as these students set goals, invent, create, overcome obstacles, and ultimately experience a personalized education that will lead to them making an impact on the world.

The Education Revolution is ensuring education WITH representation...representation of student voice and the shift of power and decision making from bureaucrats to those that education influences the most: the students. We are taking back our education system. Join the Revolution!



Nota bene

Educators, parents, students, and elected officials have spent decades attempting to make minor adjustments to the traditional assembly-line model of education. It is time to stop admiring the problem of this flawed system and create a third-order, transformational change in our education system.

For most classrooms in America, the blackboard has been replaced by a chalkboard, the chalkboard has been replaced by a whiteboard, and a whiteboard has been replaced by a smartboard. The sad reality is that students throughout the United States are bored and unmotivated in their classrooms. We are failing to prepare students for the 21st century. More importantly, education systems have not emphasized that the resolution of education is for students to make an impact on the future of our world. Yet, they can't do that without the opportunity to discover their passion and pursue their purpose.

The Education Revolution chronicles four students who left their traditional high school for a public high school that focuses on student voice, choice, and experiential learning. Until we are inclusive, equitable, accessible, and diverse enough in our education system, it will be very difficult to make progress. For true reconciliation, we must be part of the solution and not part of the problem. We have lots to work on and a ton to accomplish.

We do not profess to be the solution to our American education system. However, we are committed to end the admiration of the problems that exist in schools and focus our efforts on disrupting the old traditions. My hope is that other districts join the education revolution. To be one of the change agents by implementing such a model is only significant if others replicate it.

As the leader of Butler Tech, I look forward to taking on the challenge of the education revolution and working with dedicated staff and students across the globe to better understand how to make our world better. Our communities are demanding it, and our students deserve it.

EPISODE 2

The Student Showcases amplify student voice and embrace failure as a trajectory toward success. Ainsley and Gabe are challenged through their showcases and ultimately grow as students and young budding professionals in their fields.

EPISODE3

Overcoming Obstacles During COVID-19 & Making an IMPACT!

The documentary, filmed during the 2019-2020 school year, was ultimately impacted by COVID-19, creating yet another obstacle for the four students to overcome. Struggling through school closures, uncertainty in life after graduation, and a fear of the unknown make some of the students question their passion. Others allow the isolation and altered daily life to fuel it. In the end, see how all four students are well on their way to making an impact on the world.
